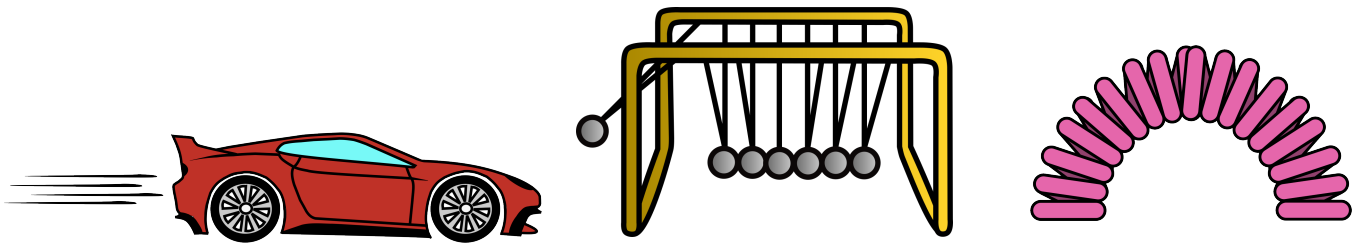


# Energy

The power or ability to make something work or be active



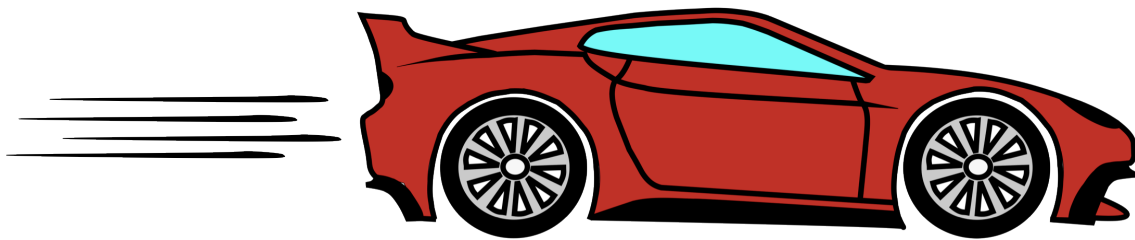
# Heat

A form of energy, or the state of being very warm; hotness; warmth.



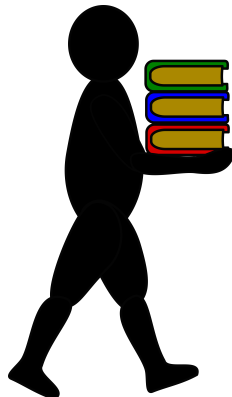
# Motion

The act or particular way of changing place; movement.



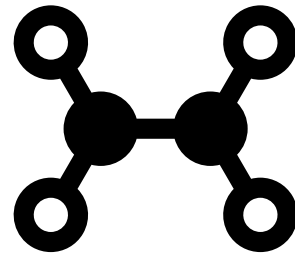
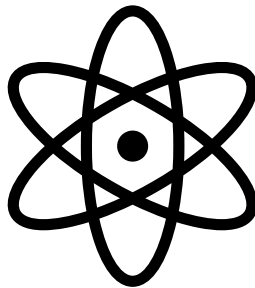
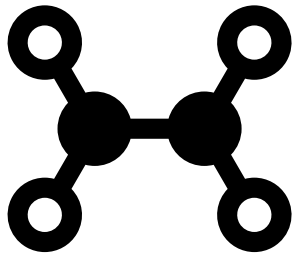
# Work

Moving something against a force, like gravity.



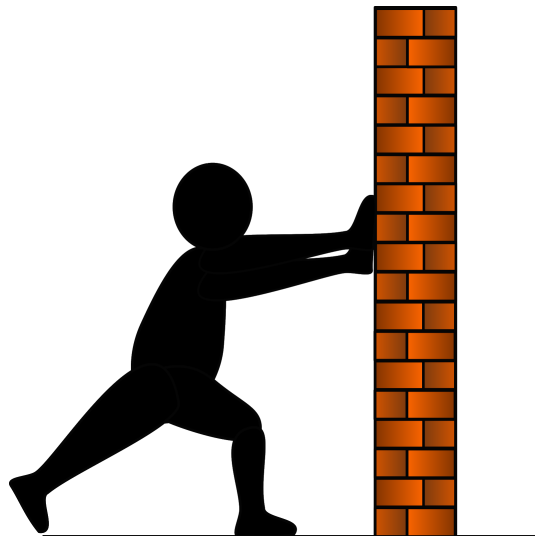
# Matter

All substances that contain atoms and take up space.



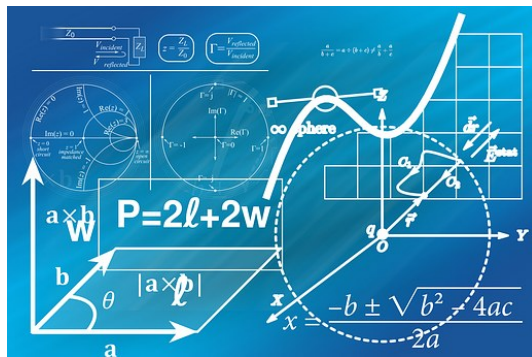
# Force

not constant.



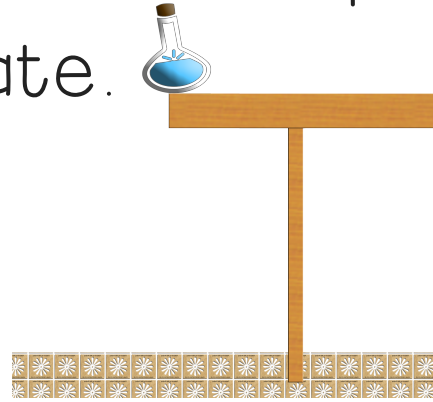
# Constants

stays constant.



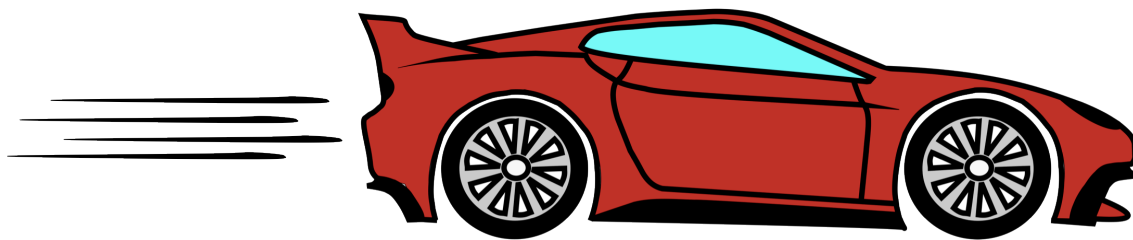
# Potential Energy

Kinetic energy is the energy an object has because of its motion.



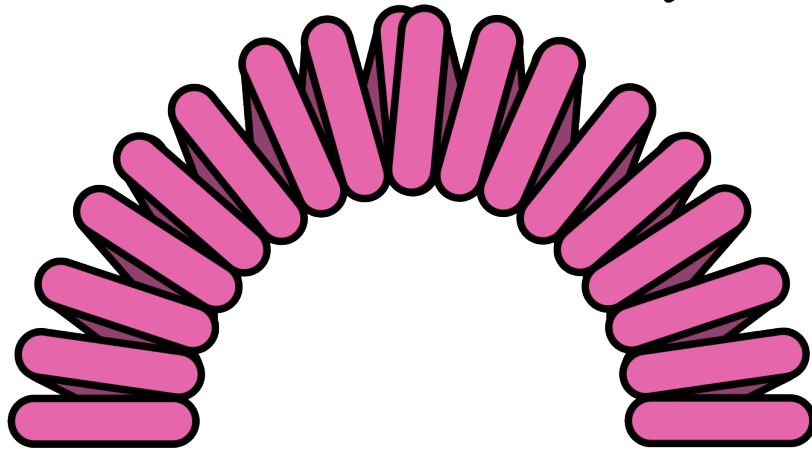
# Collision

An act or instance of coming together with force; crash.



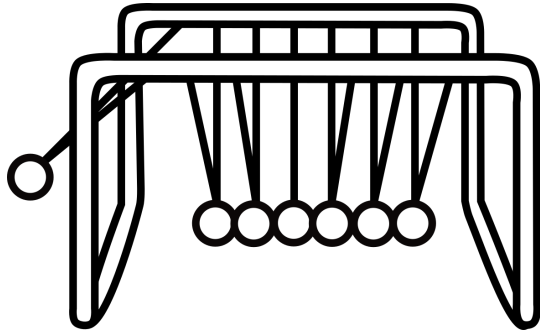
# Elastic

Pass on from one thing to another.



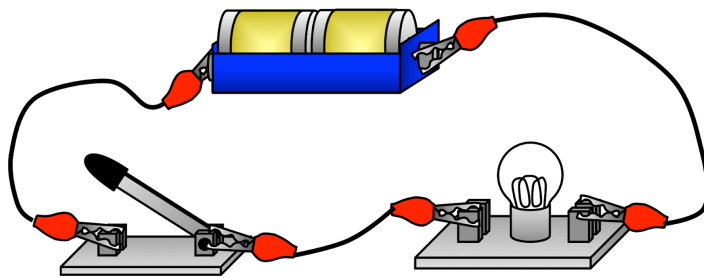
# Transformation

Energy caused by the movement of electrons through matter



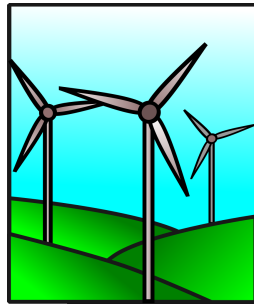
# Energy Sources

Where energy can be obtained.



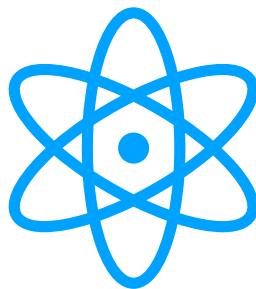
# Wind Power

Energy obtained from harnessing the power of the wind.



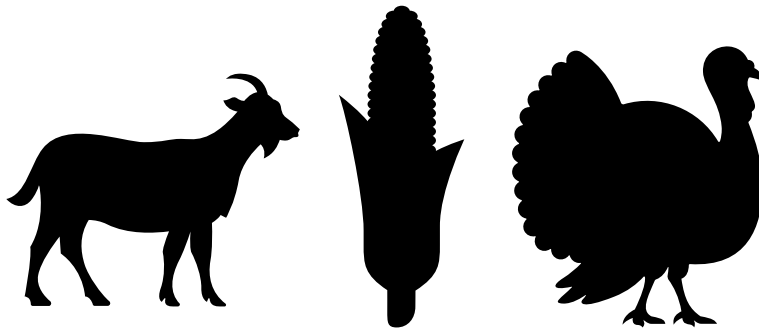
# Nuclear Energy

Oil is thick liquid known as a fossil fuel.



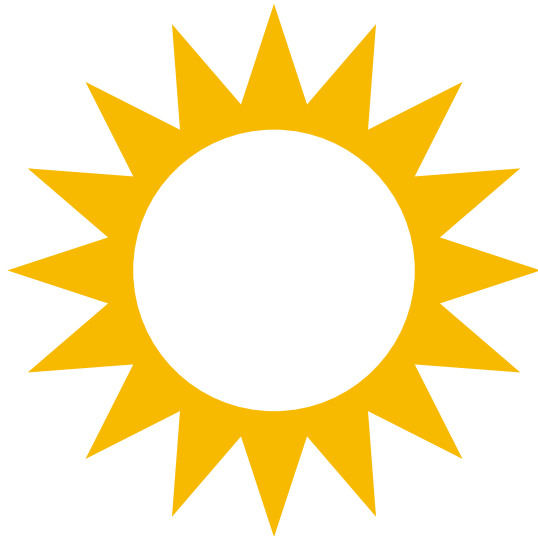
# Geothermal
