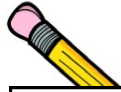

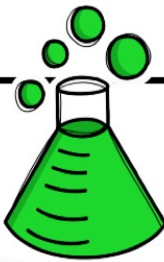

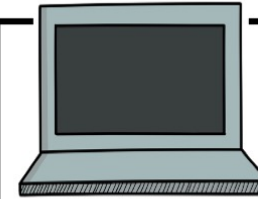

TEACHER'S PAGE

This product is designed for daily short story writing practice. It could be used as bell work like morning journals or in a writing center. Each day gives an idea, question, or story starter to ignite creative writing.

These can also be used as a power writing prompt, which is basically write whatever comes to mind when thinking of this topic (like a stream of consciousness.) Students are given a set time to complete task and see how much they can write in a given time on a topic. The power write model is about helping students overcome writer's block and reluctant writers.

For morning journal, I set a specific word count minimum so that they don't write a one sentence response. You could also make a sentence requirement. My students write on these topics in their morning journal for 15-20 minutes and need to write at least 50 words a day. They always count and record their own word count each day.

To Use: project daily topic on smartboard/whiteboard or print and put in page protector for center. You can also click the link below to make students type their response as a digital journal for center or independent work.

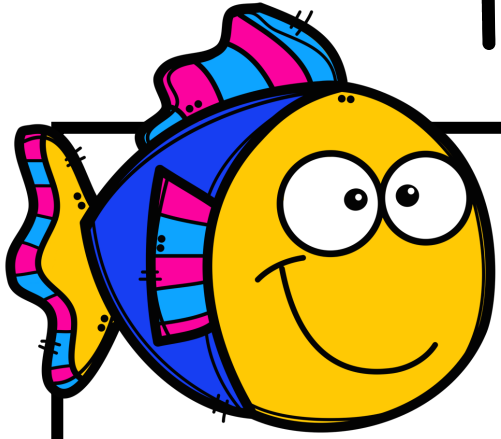

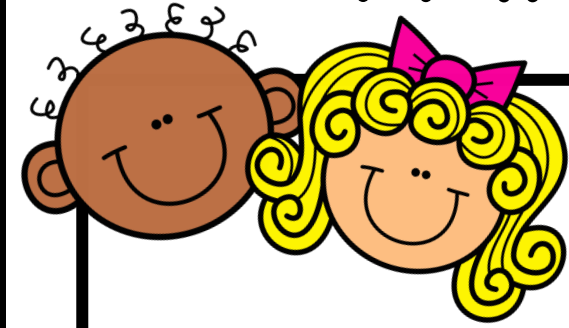
