Figurative Language

Simile - to compare two things using the words "like" or "as"

Example: He is as fast as a rabbit.

Metaphor - to compare two things using the words "is" or "are"

Example: Her smile is the sun.

Hyperbole - to describe something in an extremely exaggerated way

Example: We waited in line all day.

Onomatopoeia - a word that sounds like the noise it makes.

Example: The dog knocked over the vase with a crash!

Idiom - phrases that mean something different than what they say

Example: It's raining cats and dogs.
